Learning Experiences

Wee Green Space

The Busy Bees have enjoyed Den Building at Wee Green Space and have used magnifying glasses to hunt for bugs. On the way there, we have been identifying the numbers on the houses and the bins. We have lots of discussions with the children about the importance of outdoor play, and they enjoy taking part in risk assessments for their visits.

We go out with 5/6 children in each group every two weeks, and this is rotated on different days. A reminder of the days your child will be going to Wee Green Space is placed on the parental notice board in the Busy Bee room.

Sharing Days

The Busy Bees Sharing Day details are on the parental notice board, and they are also updated on the website. Children gain confidence and develop their language skills when speaking about what they have brought to nursery.

Stay and Play

We have been having a Stay and Play week for parents to attend in the run up to Halloween and this has gone very well. The children have been doing lots of baking activities during the week for our Bake Sale, with the proceeds going towards our charity.

Little Bunnies

The Little Bunnies had great fun learning about different countries, before moving onto their flower topic.

We had a fantastic time travelling on the public bus to the garden centre where we picked up various types of seeds to plant in the green house. With some support, the children each planted the seeds into the compost. They thoroughly enjoyed caring for their new plants, and



The children got creative whilst using kitchen roll tubes, printing their own flowers. They transferred the paint from the tray to the paper and were very intrigued to see the different patterns they created.

We have been looking at autumn, developing problem-solving skills, and the children have been colour sorting the various coloured leaves onto the corresponding-coloured tree. They demonstrated excellent concentration skills as

Cheeky Monkeys



The Cheeky Monkeys have finished learning about how to keep themselves healthy and have now moved onto looking at books, where they were given the opportunity to choose different books which they wanted to learn about.

They took a great interest in the book “The Ladybird Heard” story, and they had fun making their own ladybird cakes, collecting each of the ingredients from the shop to create them. The children developed their

numeracy skills as they helped to weigh out each of the ingredients and mix them together, and then they looked for all the red smarties to place on top of their cakes, which they then took home to eat!

The Cheeky Monkeys loved creating their own witches' hats, as they moved onto the "Room on the Broom" book. The children used a range of different textured items to create their hats, using feathers, buttons and chalk drawings which they stuck down with glue with their glue sticks. All the children then used their role play skills as they role played the "Room on the Broom"



The children created wonderful autumn lanterns, gluing various coloured and different sized leaves and glitter onto laminating pouches to create autumn lanterns. After making their lanterns, the children then used torches to shine through them.



For Halloween, the children have been participating in fun activities. They used tweezers to carefully take the spider off his web, and then counted all the legs he had, which was eight!

Busy Bees



This term, the Busy Bees have been very busy! They have been learning about recycling and why it is important to recycle. They created their own posters and were able to draw their own recycling bins. When their posters were complete, they went for a walk around the Kintore area and stuck them up to encourage people in the community to recycle more.



The children have been developing their knowledge about body parts whilst participating in body part bingo. They listened to each of the different body parts being called out as they searched their board to see if they had it, and once they found it they shouted "BINGO" and placed a coloured counter onto their board.

As you will know, the Busy Bees had their very own caterpillars and were extremely busy looking after them. The children checked their caterpillars daily and ensured they were all doing well. Once the caterpillars turned into cocoons and had hatched into butterflies, the children were delighted to release them into our garden.



The children developed their numeracy skills whilst weighing and measuring using the scales, using the autumnal loose parts with the weighing scales. Each child picked an item to put in each side and then identified which of the two items were lighter/heavier.



Trips/ Visits

Last term, the Busy Bees had a fun filled trip to The Fairy Woods at Federate where they sent their letters to the fairies in the post box. The children had a picnic after exploring the trail of Fairy doors. After finishing the trail, they were all delighted to bring back their very own pumpkins.



Laura from Flashdance in Aberdeen continues to visit the Busy Bee room every Tuesday afternoon during term time, and the Busy Bee children also visit Garioch Gymnastics every fortnight each term on a Thursday.
